



Supporting Artist Rates: London

If you work as a supporting artist on a film or TV show in London, you'll likely be paid according to the [Pact/FAA Agreement](#).

Different rates apply for day, night and shift work. You may also be entitled to supplementary fees and travel and meal allowances.

Types of working day

Standard day	A nine-hour day (including a one-hour meal break) between 7am and 10pm. Hours outside of 7am-10pm will incur nighttime overtime rates (unless booked as a night shoot).
Continuous working day	Any seven continuous hours (without a meal break), up until 10pm. After seven hours, overtime will apply. After 10pm, nighttime overtime will apply (unless called as a continuous working night).
Standard night	A nine-hour shoot (including a one-hour meal break), which is scheduled to go beyond midnight or begin before 4am.
Continuous working night	A period of seven continuous hours (without a meal break), which is scheduled to go beyond midnight or begin before 4am.
Shift call	Any four continuous hours between 6am and 11pm. After four hours, overtime penalties apply.
Non-performance call	Any call where you're not performing (e.g., a costume fitting).

Rates

Supplementary fees

You may be asked to perform specific activities or bring particular clothing, for which you'll receive a supplementary fee.

Category	Activities	Fee
A (i)	Costume provision (multiple); haircut	£23.00
A (ii)	Unused change of clothes	£11.50 per set (capped at three sets)
B	Doubling; special clothing provision; sports equipment provision; wetting down	£23.00
C	Discharge of firearms; swimming; driving; stills and scans; minimal dialogue; specialised dancing; handling domesticated animals	£30.51
D	Creative reaction; uniform provision; specialised driving; provision of car	£37.22
E	Lookalike doubling; stand-in; dialogue	£61.63

Travel allowances

The following allowances cover you getting to and from the shoot.

Category	Travel details	Allowance
A	Calls within TFL Zones 1-3	£16.12
B	Calls at Elstree, Pinewood, Longcross Shepperton, Twickenham, Leavesden or any base or location beyond TFL Zone 3 and within a 40-mile radius of Charing Cross	£22.54
C	Any call made at or before 6am (7am on Sundays or public holidays) will receive an additional payment of	£19.73

Meal allowances

If food isn't provided by the production, you'll receive the following meal allowances in line with Clause 10.6 of the Pact/FAA agreement. Meal allowances are payable in accordance with HMRC guidelines and are subject to any amendments to those guidelines.

Meal	Allowance
Breakfast	£5.00
Lunch	£10.00
Dinner	£25.00
Overnight stay	£10.00

Meal penalties

One or more of the following meal penalties might also apply under Clause 10 of the Pact/FAA agreement.

Late lunch (paid if no meal break is given within six hours of your call time (or from 7am with adequate food))	£23.38	£35.08	£35.08	£52.58
